This wonderful system will insure our horses always have fresh water, and save our volunteers hours of time cleaning and filling and occasionally patching water tanks.



We would especially like to thank the American Association of Equine Practitioners, Valley Veterinary Associates and Merck & Co. for their ongoing assistance in providing rabies and other vaccines for our horses. This is a huge benefit for the Farm.

Navajo and Prince participated in this year's TAP program at the Rankin Center, teaching 80 children and their teen mentors how horses get along with each other and with people. TAP is a program teaching tolerance and diversity through visual and performing arts.

In June, a Humane Society of the United States representative and one from Georgia Equine Rescue League and PAWS contacted us about an older woman who was having trouble keeping up with expenses for her dogs and horses. Rhonda evaluated the four horses on the premises. Two needed euthanasia: one had terminal cancer and the other was 37 years old and going downhill. Rhonda recommended diet changes and worming and assisted with hoof trimming for the other two. Thank you to Dr. Phil Carey of Vet to Pet for donating his services. The woman loves her horses, and it is great to be able to help her keep them.

NEW THOUGHTS ON SPONSORSHIP

THE PROJECT HORSE

Would it surprise you to know that a debilitated or lame horse that arrives in the shelter may need nine months to a year of rehab before he can be adopted? Or that a healthy horse may need a long period of training or re-training before he can be adopted? Some of our sponsors like a “project horse” that they can work with and rehabilitate before adoption. Maybe that would be something you would like to do, either with a full or partial sponsorship. Depending on the need of the particular horse, he might need daily care or a couple days during the week.

The new horse, Tahoe, was sponsored the same afternoon he came out of the trailer.

Consider opening your heart and working with your hands to help a horse prepare for adoption. Horses DO know when they have their own special person. The look in their eyes is different. They develop more confidence and heal faster, both physically and mentally, than when they are just one of many. Depending on your skill level with riding or ground work, or whether you would prefer one that needs nursing care, the right horse will be waiting for you. And, yes, we can train you to do this, and feed on days when you are not available.

Have the time, but can't afford even a partial sponsorship? No problem. There is a horse waiting for you in the volunteer program.

If you are not seeing the horse you want on our list of horses needing sponsorship, please contact Rhonda at 706-315-6945, and match up with a horse on the adoption list, or perhaps one that will arrive at the Farm soon.

We do still have a few horses that will never leave the Farm who need sponsors:

PEANUT—The Farm's first education pony. Peanut visits schools, works the pony rides, participates in costume in the Waverly Hall Parade every year.

HANDSOME—Gorgeous white horse with major fear issues.

IZZY—Dun stallion, very good natured. Will never be able to be ridden due to foalhood injury. Izzy has a partial (financial only) sponsorship.

PICKLEENA—registered bay Quarter Horse mare, 21 years old and going strong. She's had tons of training, but can be cold-backed. This mare knows a lot. Experienced rider only. Pickleena needs to be sponsored this year while she recovers from allergic reactions to tick bites.

RANSOM—*(pictured previous page)* Older bay with the most gorgeous sweet eyes. Very gentle. He has Cushing's disease, which is most obvious because of his long coat.

REP aka REPLICAS IMPRESSION—Over twenty-year old quarter horse gelding, full of pep. Ex-roper. Very experienced rider only. Has saddling issues.

RHETT—Black 28-year-old Tennessee Walking Horse. Has gotten over much of his shyness and will approach people, especially if they are bearing treats.

BINGO—(*Pictured bottom right*) Handsome sorrel Quarter Horse gelding, 3-year-old. Leads well. Will mature into a small horse. From cutting stock, but no papers. Accepts deworming paste and behaves well in herd situations. The best deal for Bingo is a knowledgeable and confident horse person who will understand his rough start in life. He came to us very suspicious of people, but has made great progress.



BRAYGORN— (*Pictured bottom left*) 8-year-old quiet bay Thoroughbred gelding. Off the track, used for trail riding. Has been Parelli trained. His only drawback is that he is a cribber.

THE MISSION OF BEGIN AGAIN FARMS is to rescue imperiled, retired or abandoned hooved animals; provide a safe refuge; promote rehabilitation and return to full physical ability; provide safe adoptions for rehabilitated animals; and expand the knowledge of equine science, training and horsemanship through association with community groups and leaders.
